MAY SOCIAL MEETING – DNA

There is a lot of information on this topic and it is rapidly changing. I will attempt to summarise some of the things that were mentioned on Friday and give details of websites and books which you can use to make your own decisions.

Why do I want a DNA test?

There is no right or wrong way to go, but what became obvious is that it is important to understand **why** you are considering a DNA test. What are you hoping to learn? Some of these reasons could be health (risk factors for hereditary diseases), discovering “possible” common ancestors, or an interest in the ancient migrations of people. Your reasons will impact on the type of test you take.

What kind of tests are there?

- Y-chromosome - Only for males. Often done through a surname study.
- Mitochondrial – males and females can take the test. It is inherited only down the female line i.e. your mother’s matrilineal line.
- Autosomal – for males and females Looks at your entire genetic make-up and searches for family across all lines.

Of course this is very simplified.

Which company to use?

Founded by University genealogist Professor Bryan Sykes. You can test for maternal or paternal individually or both for a slight discount. The emphasis is on ancient genealogies.

Now, to summarise our own experiences.

Ancestry

After watching these Ancestry seemed like a good option however, a couple of people who have taken the test advise caution. It is US biased and has only just started to add other countries. You do need a subscription to ancestry and if this lapses you can no longer access the matches so there is a continuing cost.

Results have been disappointing with matched people not responding to attempts to contact them.

FamilyTreeDNA

This US based firm is the biggest DNA-testing company and hosts the majority of the surname projects conducted.

The kit is sent from the USA and takes about 10 days to arrive. All instructions are included with the kit. There are different prices for different levels. It takes about 6 weeks for the first report to arrive which includes names of people with similar DNA but they provide updates in between so you know what is happening. Matches are still being sent even though the test was done 3 years ago.

The Genographic Project

Since its launch in 2005, National Geographic's Genographic Project has used advanced DNA analysis and worked with indigenous communities to help answer fundamental questions about where humans originated and how we came to populate the Earth. This test will not give you individual matches. It maps groups of people based on their DNA so if you are more interested in the ancient migrations this is the one for you.

A number of us are considering having a DNA test so I suggest we have a follow up session, perhaps in February 2017 to see if anyone has tried another company and we can compare our experiences and findings.

Finally – Take a look at...

The Resilience Project <http://resilienceproject.com/>

This project aims to discover hidden factors that protect people from disease. Led by the Icahn Institute for Genomics at Mount Sinai, in collaboration with Sage Bionetworks and others worldwide, they are searching for people who, according to medical textbooks, should be sick but have somehow escaped typical signs and symptoms of disease.

These people are “resilient,” protected by undiscovered genetic or environmental factors. Finding and studying these resilient individuals could pave the way to disease prevention and new treatments.
